DL SUMMARY NOTES

Iowa Chapter December 13-15, 2015 Victor W. Goldschmidt

Overview

Left home December 13, 2015 at 3:30 pm, arriving at DSM at 8:30 pm. There welcomed by Matt Gumm, who served as a perfect host, transporting me to the Holiday Inn downtown.

Two events were scheduled for Monday the fourteenth. The chapter lunch meeting held as a joint meeting with the local SMACNA and CSI chapters, included recognition of past presidents and a presentation on "Thinking Like an Engineer and Societal Challenges". Following a quality time with Greg Maxwell, a professor and faculty advisor to the local chapter at Iowa State (and also a very special colleague), Matt transported me to a dynamic YEA Social coordinated by Adam Puls (held at the Fox Brewery). December 15 started with a planning session with representatives from the BOG, scheduled for 7:30 to 9 am, and preceded Matt transporting me to the airport and return to Michigan.

I found this chapter to be strong, but with the opportunity to be much stronger. I felt very welcomed and was hosted in an excellent manner. There might be great opportunities to develop activities unifying and energizing the chapter for further growth. One such activity could be a planning "retreat" building on the Tuesday morning event and intentionally including more of the YEA membership as well as past presidents.

Chapter Noon Meeting - Lecture on "Thinking Like an Engineer and Societal Challenges"

This was a combined meeting with SMACNA and CSI, and I was pleased to refer to our president's theme of "Making

Connections" and challenging the three chapters to consider joint activities such as outreach. It was also a time for Iowa to honor past presidents. The presentation stressed the importance of critical thinking ("ask questions"), the nature of engineering problems invariably with alternative solutions, and the need for creativity and in turn recognizing the importance of right brain and subconscious thinking. I was intentional in presenting a slide with a picture of David



Underwood and his presidential theme, as well as pictures of the corresponding presidents for SMACNA and CSI and available mission statements.

Adam coordinated the event in a brewery open only for this event. There were more than twenty YEA members present, and to my surprise many did not know most of those present. Apparently this YEA group meets only infrequently. There is a great potential in this group, and hopefully this past meeting will lead to more activities and ultimately chapter and broader involvement.









My comments were in the form of informal dialog, underscoring the importance of envisioning, equipping, empowering, edifying, and evaluating in leadership - as well as some of the hazards of change. Past successes and failures in my role as a leader were shared reinforcing the importance of the "5 E's".



Working breakfast with BOG.

Held in a quiet area of a local eatery, the planning event started shortly after 7:30am, and ended near 9:00 am. Matt and Adam were present representing the BOG and we accomplished quite a bit. In the form of a summary:







* I highlighted the contents of strategic plans, and outlined a process I have found most effective. First step: through a consensus process determine core values, and following consideration of relational webs, and drawing sketches for a chapter's vision, through a consensus process develop a vision statement. Second step: intentional ideation session to develop (accompanied by creativity enhancing exercises) a long list of potential action items. Third step: grouping and prioritization of the listed action items. Fourth step: naming the groups as individual goals, and rewording the corresponding high priority items in the form of objectives. The Mission Statement then can be easily formulated based on the selected goals developed with the vision in mind.

- * We completed the first step, and now expecting to schedule a planning session (of no less than four hours) to follow up on the first step and work toward listing action items and drafting goals and objectives
- * The output of this first stept:
 - Core values were selected:

collaboration:

education:

innovation;

quality (improvement);

outreach.

- Vision statement was developed:
 - "Community Invested in Engineering and Energy"

these should form the building block for the more extensive (and intensive) planning session.

Tech Awards

Walgreens Net Zero Store

Benjamin A. Skelton, P.E., BEMP, president, Cyclone Energy Group, Chicago, Ill., receives first place in the new commercial buildings category for the Walgreens Net Zero Store, Evanston, Ill. The building is owned by Walgreen Co.

The global retail pharmacy brand set out with a vision to create a scalable retail building design that would serve as a showcase for innovative, sustainable and high performance design to sustainability, architecture, engineering and retail communities. The store is designed to achieve net zero energy use by the National Renewable Energy Laboratory's most stringent definition of "renewable energy generated within the building footprint."

Among its innovative features are:

- 840 roof-mounted solar panels, generating enough energy to power 30 Illinois homes for a year
- two 35-foot-tall wind turbines, using winds from Lake Michigan to generate enough power to offset annual greenhouse gas emissions from 2.2 passenger vehicles
- geo-exchange energy obtained by drilling 550 feet into the ground below the store
- LED lighting and daylight harvesting
- carbon dioxide refrigerant for heating, cooling and refrigeration equipment
- energy efficient building materials

The owner set out with a vision to create a store that would be an innovation laboratory to test products, materials, systems and equipment that could be incorporated into prototype designs and retrofit throughout existing stores. Walgreens also wanted to share the results from the design, construction and ongoing operation of the store with the public, design community and even their competition. The store is designed to facilitate tours, including hosting executives and designers from their retail competition.
