

Water Battery Powers Air-Conditioning Systems

A three-story "water battery" is producing enough energy to power a university's air-conditioning systems, which is reducing its reliance on the grid by more than 40%. The water battery is a thermal energy storage system that uses energy generated by a 2.1-megawatt photovoltaic system to cool 4.5 megaliters of water resting inside a three-story tank. The campus' air-conditioning systems use the cooled water. <u>Read more</u>

MIT Creates System that Cools Without Using Electricity

A new system provides cooling with no electricity by using the process of radiative cooling. The device, which has no moving parts, uses an aerogel insulation that blocks and reflects visible rays of sunlight. The system can keep fruits and vegetables from spoiling and can help double the time the produce remains fresh in remote places where reliable power for refrigeration is not available. <u>Read more</u>

Winners, Finalists Named in 2020 AHR Expo Innovation Awards

Some of the most inventive and original products, systems and technologies that will be on display at the 2020 AHR Expo in Orlando, Fla., on Feb. 3–5 have been announced as winners and finalists for the annual AHR Expo Innovation Awards. Ten winners and 30 finalists were selected. The AHR Expo Product of the Year will be announced during the Expo.

Retrofitting HVAC Systems Could Create Renewable Energy Opportunities

Researchers are proposing retrofitting air-conditioning units as integrated, scalable and renewable-powered devices capable of decentralized CO_2 conversion and energy democratization. Adapting air conditioning systems to be able to capture and convert carbon dioxide and water into renewable hydrocarbon fuels can create oil wells. The oil wells can be tapped, shared and stored, with the option for the property owner to receive payment for any excess fed into a renewable oil grid. <u>Read more</u>

Using Intelligent Workstations to Boost Employee Production

The University of Southern California and Arup are designing a workstation that uses artificial intelligence that will adjust to worker preferences and patterns to improve overall employee well-being. Thermal comfort is a priority, as it affects health, especially in people who are prone to type 2 diabetes, heart disease and obesity. <u>Read more</u>


