Term: 3 years, DRC-appointed

Travel: CRC, Regional Planning, chapter visits as needed

#### Position Description (from the Regional and Chapter Historians Guide, June 2018):

In June 1978, the position of Regional Historian was created by the ASHRAE Board of Directors and is appointed by the Director and Regional Chair (DRC). Guidelines were established by the Society Historical Committee for the Regional Historians as follows:

- 1. Aid and encourage the chapter historian and communicate often.
- Receive and retain chapter publications and minutes of the annual CRC, under the guidance
  and direction of the DRC. Also, receive copies of communications from headquarters' staff
  that are sent by the Society to chapter historians.
- Seek regional sources of artifacts, photographs and documentary articles relating to the HVAC industry through chapter historians.
- Collect historical pictures and data that could be used for publication from major manufacturers who are willing to furnish them.
- Make inquiries through chapters as to which libraries have materials, publications and references of interest to our members as well as which libraries would be willing to receive such items.
- Oversee PAOE points for the current year on the ASHRAE website for Historical that are entered by the chapter historians and enter points that are assigned to the Regional historian...
- 7. Coordinate time and facilities for the annual CRC with the DRC & General Chair to hold a workshop for chapter historians and encourage historians' attendance.
  - Note: The <u>regional historian</u> shall <u>assemble</u> electronic materials for distribution to chapter hist<del>orians</del> prior to or immediately after the CRC workshop. This is to be used for reference and <u>guidance</u>.
- 8. Review and seek comments on the individual chapter Gold Ribbon entries, send in entries to Society and present Gold Ribbon Awards at CRC.
- 9. Maintain and record lists of all members receiving Regional and Society Awards.
- 10. Maintain a list of all regional officers.
- Prepare and annually update the history for the region on the Historical Committee's website.

#### Turbomachine Expander Offers Efficiency, Safety for Heating, Cooling

Purdue University researchers developed a device to decrease energy consumption of the vapor-compression heat pump cycle, which is commonly used in homes, businesses and vehicles for cooling and heating. The team created a novel turbomachine expander that helps

#### Astronauts Replace Coolant Pumps on International Space Station

Two astronauts spent more than six hours installing replacement coolant pumps during a spacewalk on Monday. The astronauts attached the 350-lb (159 kg) pump module to the 6.8 metric ton Alpha Magnetic Spectrometer (AMS), plugged in power and data cables and spliced together eight existing coolant lines. The AMS was not designed to be serviced in orbit, so connecting the coolant lines while working in pressurized spacesuits was especially challenging. Read more

#### MIT Creates System that Cools Without Using Electricity

A new system provides cooling with no electricity by using the process of radiative cooling. The device, which has no moving parts, uses an aerogel insulation that blocks and reflects visible rays of sunlight. The system can keep fruits and vegetables from spoiling and can help double the time the produce remains fresh in remote places where reliable power for refrigeration is not available. Read more

#### Thermal Comfort Model Measures Body Shape With Sensors

A team at Carnegie Mellon University has created the first model that combines environmental information with data on an individual's body shape to determine thermal comfort. Information is aggregated to find the temperature that the most occupants possible will find comfortable. The system estimates body shape information from depth-imaging sensors, which are less privacy-invasive than approaches such as cameras. Read more

#### Water Battery Powers Air-Conditioning Systems

A three-story "water battery" is producing enough energy to power a university's air-conditioning systems, which is reducing its reliance on the grid by more than 40%. The water battery is a thermal energy storage system that uses energy generated by a 2.1-megawatt photovoltaic system to cool 4.5 megaliters of water resting inside a three-story tank. The campus' air-conditioning systems use the cooled water. Read more


